Grazing Management

Thursday January 12th 6:30pm Belington Volunteer Fire Department Speaker: Dr. Jeff Lehmkhuler Extension Beef Cattle Specialist for the University of Kentucky, who developed the Kentucky Master Stocker program. Jeff is a co-chair of the Master Grazer program committee which delivers the Kentucky Grazing School, Advanced Grazing School, Lengthening the Grazing Season sessions and on-farm pasture management demonstrations. He received the 2016 Southern Section American Society of Animal Science Extension Award for his accomplishments in outreach efforts.

Woods & Wildlife

Thursday February 9th 6:30pm Camp Pioneer in Beverly <u>Speakers:</u> Dave McGill & Sheldon Owen This program will provide woodland owners a better understanding of woodland ownership, forest ecology, and the sound application of forest and wildlife management practices. By laying rock and gravel down atop filter fabric, this heavy use area will no longer be flooded after heavy rain and will allow for better traction for vehicle use. To the left is a before and after picture of flood cleanup work our crew performed in Clay County. Brush and debris was removed as well as stabilizing the streambank. Below our crew sets a 400 gallon watering trough. Our district sells these and other troughs and float parts.

Intermediate Beekeeping Classes

This series of classes caters to established beekeepers and will focus on the seasonal management of beehives. Following a year long management model, the class will provide an overview of seasonal duties and tasks to help maintain a healthy hive. This includes possible problems and solutions, such as pest management, queen rearing, and swarming.

There will be four classes in this series, with each focusing on a different season. The classes will run from 6:30-8:30 pm on the following dates: February 21st - Winter February 28th - Spring March 7th - Summer March 14th - Fall

Roller-Crimper for Rent

TVCD now offers a 4-foot roller-crimper for district cooperators to rent. The roller -crimper is a useful tool to be used as an alternative to high intensity tillage of small scale vegetable and grain producers.

This three-point hitch attachment is suited best for a small tractor that is capable of pulling 1200lbs. Contact our office to make arrangements for renting the roller-crimper. The cost to rent is \$30/day.
