Green Bean	Strike (55 Days)	2 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Very high yield. Exceptionally straight pods are smooth and slender. The first choice for roadside stands. Pick at young stage.					
Beets	Detroit Dark Red (58 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
A globe-shaped, dark red beet. Average size is 2-1/2 to 3 in. in diameter. Interior is dark red with slight zoning. The tender quality makes this beet an excellent table and canning variety. Tops are 12 to 15 in. long and a glossy dark green color.					
Cantaloupe	Burpee Hybrid (82 Days)	20 seeds	\$3.00/packet		
Still the most popular variety. 4 to 4-1/2 lb. fruits are heavily netted, ribbed, round to slightly oval. Thick deep orange flesh is firm, juicy, sweet and delicious. Muskmelons require a fertile soil, rich with organic matter.					
Cucumber	Boston Pickling (57 Days)	1/8 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
A black spine variety. Dark green fruits are blunt-ended and measure 5 to 6 in. long by 3 to 3-1/2 in. in diameter at maturity.					
Lettuce	Loose Leaf Salad (40-72 Days)	1/8 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
A special blend of our most popular loose-leaf lettuces – a complete salad in one.					
Okra	Clemson Spineless (55 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Plants are erect and 3-1/2 to 4 ft. tall. The medium green pods are 6 to 7" long, straight, slim, tapered, ridged and spineless.					
Pea (Hull)	Wando (70 Days)	2 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
The "hot weather pea" because it is more tolerant to heat than other varieties. Vines are 28 to 30" tall, upright, dark green with small size leaves. Pods are 2-1/2 to 3" long, dark green, straight, blunt, borne both singly and in pairs. Each pod contains 8 to 10 good quality, dark green and wrinkled peas. Generally used for home gardens and freezing.					
Pea (Sugar/Edible Pods)	Oregon Sugar Pod (60 Days)	2 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Vines vary from 14 to 30" tall. The pods are 4" long by 7/8" round, light green, smooth, mild flavor, and highly resistant to Enation Mosaic Virus, and moderately resistant to Pea Streak Virus. Resistant to Fusarium Pea Wilt. Great pea for Stir-fry!					
Pumpkin	Small Sugar (108 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Fruits are round, flattened at ends, measuring 8 by 10", weighing 6 to 8 lbs. and deep orange in color. Flesh is orange-yellow and fine textured. A favorite pie and canning variety, good winter keeper.					
Radish	Early Scarlet Globe (23 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Medium top with globular, scarlet red roots. Flesh is crisp and white. A long-time favorite with home gardeners.					
Spinach	Bloomsdale Long Standing (45 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Semi-erect plants are large. Leaves are savoyed, large and dark green. Slower to bolt, and therefore, can be used for late spring and summer crop.					
Squash	Straight neck Early Prolific (50 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Fruit become 10" long by about 3" in diameter, is club-shaped, some warting and is lemon-yellow turning golden at maturity. Should be used when fruit is 5 to 6 in. long. Flesh is creamy-yellow, firm, tender and succulent. Early, prolific, bush type plant.					
Squash	Dark Green Zucchini (62 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Fruit measures 12" long by 4" in diameter and is straight, cylindrical and dark greenish black in color. Flesh is greenish-white at edible stage with delicate flavor. Bush type plant is suitable for small garden. Fruit should be picked when only a few days old.					
Squash	Waltham Butternut (110 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Fruits measure 10 to 12" long by 5" in diameter. Much more uniform than common Butternut. Rind is smooth, hard, tough and cream colored. Light yellow flesh is dry. A vining type.					
Turnip	Purple Top White Globe (57 Days)	1/4 oz.	\$3.00/packet		
Purple Top Turnips are Large roots, smooth, globe shaped, 5 to 6" in diameter, purple across top with white beneath. Flesh is white, fine grained, crisp and tender with a little bit of spicy. Tops are 18 to 22 inch tall, dark green. An all-purpose variety used extensively for home-gardening and shipping.

VEGETABLE	Variety	Seeding Recommendations:
Green Bean	Strike (55 Days)	2 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow seeds 1 in. deep and space 2 to 4" apart. Can be planted any time after danger of frost is past and soil is warm or about April 15 - Aug.15.
Beets	Detroit Dark Red (58 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow seeds 1 in. deep and spaced about 2" apart in rows 12 in. apart or more. Sow seeds as early in spring when the ground can be worked.
Cantaloupe	Burpee Hybrid (82Days)	20 seeds sow a 25 ft. row. Plant in rich soil after all danger of frost has past and soil is warm. Sow 4 seeds 1 in. deep in hills of 18 to 24" apart in rows 4 to 5 feet apart. Can be planted from April to June.
Cucumber	Boston Pickling (57 Days)	1/8 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Cucumbers require warm, rich, well-drained soil. Highly susceptible to disease and adverse weather. Plant 4 seeds per hill about 1" deep until July. Space hills about 3 ft. apart. Cucumber require warm, rich, well-drained and limed soil.
Lettuce	Loose Leaf Salad	1/8 oz. sows a 50 ft. row. Lettuce can be planted as soil is prepared in spring. Sow seed thinly 18 in. from next row. Scatter seed thinly in a furrow and cover with 1/4 in. of soil. Thin to 8 in. apart.
Okra	Clemson Spineless (55 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Plant 1" deep after danger of frost is past. Space seeds 2" apart in rows 2 to 4 ft. apart. Thin plants to 1 to 2 ft. apart. As plants begin to bear fruit, pick every 2 to 3 days.
Pea	Wando (70 Days) Oregon Sugar Pod (60 Days)	2 oz. sows a 12 ft. row. Sow seed 2" deep and space 1-2" apart. Can be planted from March to June. For an early crop, plant as soon ground can be worked.
Pumpkin	Small Sugar (108 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 50 ft. row. Plant 4-6 seeds 1" deep in groups. Space 8 ft. or more apart, or sow in rows. 1 plant every 2-3 ft. Plant late May to July.
Radish	Early Scarlet Globe (23 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Can be sown anytime from March to September. Plants should be spaced 1/2 to 1 in. apart in rows 12 in. apart. Winter varieties should be planted after July.
Spinach	Bloomsdale Long Standing (45 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow seeds 1 in. deep. Plants should be spaced 1 1/2 to 2 in. apart in rows that are 12 to 18 in. apart. Plant early spring or September.
Squash	Straight neck Early Prolific (50 Days) Dark Green Zucchini (62 Days) Waltham Butternut (110 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow in May 1 – July 15. Sow 4 to 6 seeds 1" deep in hills every 4 ft. in rows 3 to 4 ft. apart.
Turnip	Purple Top White Globe (57 Days)	1/4 oz. sows a 50 ft. row. Sow seeds 1/4 to 1/2 in. deep and space 2 to 4 in. apart in rows 18 to 24 in. apart. Plant anytime from April to August.
