VEGETABLE Variety Seeding Recommendations: 2 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow seeds 1 in. deep and space 2 to 4" apart. Can be planted any time after danger of frost is past and soil is warm or Strike (55 Days) Green Bean about April 15 - Aug.15. 1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow seeds 1 in. deep and spaced about 2" apart in rows 12 in. apart or more. Sow seeds as early in spring when Beets Detroit Dark Red (58 Days) the ground can be worked. 20 seeds sow a 25 ft. row. Plant in rich soil after all danger of frost has past and soil is warm. Sow 4 seeds 1 in. deep in hills of 18 to 24" apart Cantaloupe Burpee Hybrid (82Days) in rows 4 to 5 feet apart. Can be planted from April to June. 1/8 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Cucumbers require warm, rich, well-drained soil. Highly susceptible to disease and adverse weather. Plant 4 seeds Boston Pickling (57 Days) Cucumber per hill about 1" deep until July. Space hills about 3 ft. apart. Cucumber require warm, rich, well-drained and limed soil. 1/8 oz. sows a 50 ft. row. Lettuce can be planted as soil is prepared in spring. Sow seed thinly 18 in. from next row. Scatter seed thinly in a Loose Leaf Salad Lettuce furrow and cover with 1/4 in. of soil. Thin to 8 in. apart. 1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Plant 1" deep after danger of frost is past. Space seeds 2" apart in rows 2 to 4 ft. apart. Thin plants to 1 to 2 ft. apart. Okra Clemson Spineless (55 Days) As plants begin to bear fruit, pick every 2 to 3 days. 2 oz. sows a 12 ft. row. Sow seed 2" deep and space 1-2" apart. Can be planted from March to June. For an early crop, plant as soon ground Wando (70 Days) Pea Oregon Sugar Pod (60 Days) can be worked. 1/4 oz. sows a 50 ft. row. Plant 4-6 seeds 1" deep in groups. Space 8 ft. or more apart, or sow in rows. 1 plant every 2-3 ft. Plant late May to Pumpkin Small Sugar (108 Days) July. Radish Early Scarlet Globe (23 Days) 1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Can be sown anytime from March to September. Plants should be spaced 1/2 to 1 in. apart in rows 12 in. apart. Winter varieties should be planted after July. Bloomsdale Long Standing (45 Days) 1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow seeds 1 in. deep. Plants should be spaced 1 ½ to 2 in. apart in rows that are 12 to 18 in. apart. Plant early Spinach spring or September. 1/4 oz. sows a 25 ft. row. Sow in May 1 – July 15. Sow 4 to 6 seeds 1" deep in hills every 4 ft. in rows 3 to 4 ft. apart. Straight neck Early Prolific (50 Days) Squash Dark Green Zucchini (62 Davs) Waltham Butternut (110 Days) 1/4 oz. sows a 50 ft. row. Sow seeds ¼ to ½ in. deep and space 2 to 4 in. apart in rows 18 to 24 in. apart. Plant anytime from April to August. Turnip Purple Top White Globe (57 Days)
