f you missed previous sign-up periods, don't worry. Agriculture Enhancement Program (AgEP) applications will be available October 17th through November 2nd.

AgEP is administered by the Northern Panhandle Conservation District with assistance from the West Virginia Conservation Agency. AgEP supports the agriculture community through a series of cost-share practices landowners can participate in to reduce soil erosion, provide alternative water for their livestock, and improve productivity of their lands.

AgEP applications will be available for the following practices: Fencing for grazing, stream protection and woodland exclusion; Water Systems, Lime; Invasive Species Control; Fertilizer; Forage and Frost Reseeding; Heavy-Use Protection; and Urban Agriculture.

Applications for West Virginia Century Farm Contest are due April 1, 2017.

The West Virginia Century Farm Program is designed to acknowledge those families who have been farming the same tract of land for at least 100 years. A family member must live on the farm or be an integral part of the day-to-day farm operations. The farm must

consist of at least 10 acres of the original holdings and gross more than \$1,000 annually from farm products.

HANDS-ON AG DAY 2016

Students were led in small groups by John Marshall High School Horticulture students through a series of eleven stations throughout the day.

Participating agencies included: NPCD, NRCS, FSA, WV Department of Agriculture, WV Conservation Agency, WVU Extension Service, Marshall County Fair, Farm Bureau, Marshall County Commission, John Marshall Future Farmers of America and Marshall County Schools.

FARM FIELD DAY AND DINNER

Stockpiled forage is not an acceptable entrée, but it is good dinner topic for a room full of farmers. The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in cooperation with the Northern Panhandle Conservation District co-hosted an agriculture educational dinner and farm field day to present information on stockpiled forages and soil health.

"Programs like this allow local farmers and landowners the opportunity to learn "hands-on" about different conservation practices and how to carry them out on their own land," said

Katie Fitzsimmons, NRCS district conservationist of Marshall County, WV. "By partnering with local conservation districts and local land owners it not only gives us an opportunity to share resources but also helps make our communities healthier and stronger."

The educational dinner was held on Friday, September 23, at the Limestone Community Building in Limestone, WV. Bob Hendershot, retired OH NRCS state grassland conservationist, spoke on winter feeding and stockpiling (storing) fescue forages. Information was provided on how to best use forage, who to contact, financial assistance for forage testing, and how to best understand the results.

The farm field day and pasture walk was held on Saturday, September 24, at Keith and Terri Hieronimus' farm in Sherrard, WV. The field day featured topics on soil and animal health, while the pasture walk identified various grasses and weeds and how to best manage them. Tim Dilliplane, WV NRCS resource

soil scientist, demonstrated the use of a portable rainfall simulator and its use as a tool in soil erosion research. Dilliplane also discussed soil properties and provided information to assist land users in determining the soils' suitability or limitations for specified uses.

The WV NRCS and the WV Conservation Districts plan to co-host more of these educational dinners and field days to help our local farmers.
