Upcoming Winter Dinner Meetings

It's time for the annual Winter Dinner Meeting series for local farmers. There will be a series of 3 meetings held within Tygart's Valley Conservation District.

The Tygarts Valley Conservation District, in conjunction with the WVU Extension Service, will be sponsoring the Ag Dinner Meetings this winter. The first meeting will be January 9th at the Belington Fire Hall at 6:00 pm. David Marrison will present on the topic of Transition Planning. David Marrison is an Associate Professor & Agricultural & Natural Resources Extension Educator for OSU Extension located in Ashtabula County in northeast, Ohio. David has been the Extension Educator since 1997 and is currently the co-leader of OSU's Ag Manager Team which authors a monthly farm and agribusiness management newsletter. Deadline for reservations is January 3rd.

The February 6th meeting will be Opportunities and Challenges to Grazing 300 days in West Virginia by Ben Goff and will be held at Camp Pioneer in Randolph County. Reservations deadline is February 1st.



The March 6th Meeting will be held at the Parsons Senior Center and the topic will be Ag In Appalachia Implications of a Changing Climate presented by Jason Hubbard & Evan Kutta. Deadline for reservations is February 28th.
