<b>COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE</b> ( <i>Picea pungens glauca</i> )	A pyramidal, medium to large (70 feet) evergreen with a bluish to green cast. Branches have sharp one-inch needles and 2 to 4 inch cones. Will reach 6 feet in 9 years. Grows in acidic, drought tolerant, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, well drained, wet, wide range, and clay soils. Slow to medium growth.			☺				☼	
<b>NORWAY SPRUCE</b> ( <i>Picea abies</i> )	Fast growing to 100 feet and long-lived. Graceful tendrils are a favorite for landscapes and windbreaks. Grows to 6 feet in 7 years. Space 6 feet for windbreaks. All soil types.		f	☺		↑		☼	
<b>EUROPEAN LARCH</b> ( <i>Larix decidua</i> )	Ornamental deciduous conifer native of the Alpine and Subalpine areas of Eastern Europe. European larch grows best on uniformly moist, deep, fertile soils. It does not do well on pure sand. Mature height usually ranges from 30 to 130 feet. Exhibits rapid early growth.		f					☼	
<b>AMERICAN ARBORVITAE</b> ( <i>Thuja occidentalis</i> )	A handsome pyramidal evergreen with foliage varying from dark green to light green during growing season. A very hardy, easily transplanted evergreen that grows well in a variety of soils, but best in loamy moist soil. Excellent for screens and tall hedges. Easily sheared. Grows 40-60 feet tall with a 10-15 foot spread. Slow to medium growth.							🌳	
<b>WHITE PINE</b> ( <i>Pinus strobus</i> )	Popular fast growing conifer is prized for landscaping, windbreaks, and wildlife use. Needles are long and soft. Grows to 6 feet in 7 years. Maximum height can be 60 to 100 feet. Protect from deer when young. Well drained, moist sandy or clay loam soils.	N	f		●	↑		🌳	🍂
<b>WHITE OAK</b> ( <i>Quercus alba</i> )	Broad, round dense head, spreading branches and purple-red fall color. Leaves remain on tree for winter interest, bark light gray and flaked. Shade tolerant, found on variety of sites and grows best in deep, sandy loam soils on south and west facing slopes. Grows to 100 feet or more.	N			●				🍂
<b>SUGAR MAPLE</b> ( <i>Acer saccharum</i> )	A handsome tree for shade. Rounded head with dense green foliage having serrated three to five lobed leaves. The smooth silvery bark becomes darker as the tree ages. Mature trees produce sap in spring that can be used for making delicious maple syrup and sugar. Wood of these trees is hard maple, valuable for floors and furniture making. Mature height approximately 70 to 100 feet. Broadleaf: leaves opposite, simple, 3-5 inches across with 5 pointed lobes and brilliant fall color. Slow growing with a beautiful symmetrical crown. Grows well in deep well drained soils.	N				↑	☼		
<b>SYCAMORE</b> ( <i>Platanus Occidentalis</i> )	Broadleaf leaves alternate, 4 to 8 inches long, stems reddish brown. Wet lowlands to drier uplands, surface spoil. Large tree grows 100 feet high or more.	N	f						🍂
<b>EUROPEAN BLACK ALDER</b> ( <i>Alnus Glutinosa</i> )	Broadleaf, wet to drier soils, improves surface spoils. Fixes Nitrogen in the soil. Grows 50 to 80 feet high. Fast growing but will generally live only 15-20 years.	N							🍂
<b>COMMON CHOKECHERRY</b> ( <i>Prunus virginiana</i> )	A bushy tree growing to 25 feet producing dark-red cherries in summer. Excellent for wildlife, growing well in a wide range of soils. *PLEASE NOTE*: HAZARDOUS TO LIVESTOCK.								🍂
<b>APPLES:</b>  <b>MUST HAVE BOTH FOR POLLINATION</b>	<b>Ultima Gala:</b> Ultima™ Gala exhibits a very prominent stripe and with good thinning practices will size very well for Gala. Trees are well anchored, resistant to collar rot and woolly aphids. A good selection for heavy, poorly-drained soils. Blooms mid-season and the maturity date is September 2. Approximate height will be 20 feet.  <b>Honeycrisp:</b> The fruit is mostly orange-red with a yellow background. This crisp, juicy, sweet-tart apple has a rich flavor that has made it #1 in taste panels. The fruit averages three inches and up, matures ten days before Red Delicious and stores well. Outstanding winter hardiness gives this variety excellent potential for northern growing regions. Honeycrisp™ is moderately resistant to apple scab. Loamy, well-drained soil with a pH level of 6.0 – 7.0. Tree is non-vigorous and late-blooming. Blooms mid-season and the maturity date is September 10.						☺	↑	
<b>SWEET CHERRY:</b> <b>Black Gold</b>	A dark red cherry ripening just ahead of Hedelfingen. A Stella x Gold cross. The trees are late blooming, producing firm fruit with good size. Requires full sun. Loamy and well drained-average moistness soil with pH level 6.0-7.0. Maturity Date: Mid June.			☺		↑			
<b>NECTARINE: Flavortop</b>	A large, attractive mid-season nectarine ripening after Sunglo. The fruit is very firm, freestone and very good quality. The tree is vigorous, moderately productive and is susceptible to bacterial spot. Approximate height will be 8 feet. Maturity Date: August 20.					↑			
<b>PLUM: Methley</b>	An early plum with fine quality and appearance. The fruit is purple with red, sweet flesh, very juicy with a distinctive flavor. Ripening in early to mid-July. Methley is self-fertile and does not need to be cross pollinated. Maturity Date: July 15. This tree grows in a wide variety of soil types and has some tolerance for heavy and waterlogged soils. It prefers a well-drained, loamy, mildly acidic to mildly alkaline soil. Can grow 10 to 20 feet tall and wide.			☺		↑
