

State Junior Conservation Camp Scholarships Available

A limited number of scholarships are available for the 36th annual West Virginia Junior Conservation Camp, scheduled June 20-24 at Cedar Lakes in Ripley. The scholarships cover the full cost of the overnight camp, where Mountain State youth, ages 11-14, can learn about the outdoors and protecting the state's natural resources.

Sponsored by the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) Youth Environmental Program, the camp offers a wide variety of classes that focus on a sound environmental education. Approximately 200 campers will learn how to conserve West Virginia's natural resources by attending classes on wildlife, archery, recycling, canoeing, geocaching/orienteering, hunter safety, water study, forestry, fishing, nature trail exploration and more. Sports activities will include swimming, basketball, kickball, volleyball, wiffle ball and relay races.

Camp assemblies are scheduled for Monday evening, as well as Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Past camp presentations have included a snake demonstration from the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (DNR); an energy efficiency program from the DEP's Division of Air Quality; the West Virginia Division of Forestry's fire dog demonstration; and the DNR's mechanical deer and turkey demonstrations. Campfire programs are set for Monday through Wednesday nights, with a dance scheduled for Thursday night.

Many dedicated and knowledgeable employees from the DEP, DNR, Division of Forestry and West Virginia University Extension Service serve as camp counselors and leaders. The cost of sending a child to camp is \$172. The deadline for paying the application fee is May 1.
