Program Eligibility

Definition:

A constructed barrier for livestock.

Purpose:

- Reduce erosion and improve water quality by controlling livestock that currently have access to woodlands, streams, springs, wetlands, and ponds.
- To divide pasture fields to accomplish better pasture grazing management.

Policies for Program:

- Applicant must be a District Cooperator. (a form is available upon request)
- Applicant is ineligible for a practice reimbursement if he/she starts project before District approval.
- No duplication of federal or state cost-share shall be allowed.
- When an applicant has cancelled an AgEP Agreement for two fiscal years, he/she will not be eligible to participate for the next two immediate fiscal years.
- Government land is ineligible.
- Property must be used as a farming operation to be eligible for the program: having the potential for producing at least \$1000 of farm products annually.

- In combination with other practices applicant **cannot** exceed **\$7,000.00** of assistance per fiscal year (July 2021-June 2022).
- Application approvals will be made based upon availability of funds and a ranking process.

Policies for Practice:

- Livestock must be present on property or landowner must have livestock <u>and</u> demonstrate the need for the fence.
- Care must be given to protect water quality during and after installation.
- Fence construction must follow the recommendation of the USDA-NRCS and/or the manufacture's recommendations.
- A job sheet with fencing specifications will be provided that includes: Height, type, spacing, and other guidance will be provided that best provides the needs of the livestock and use of the fence.
- Fencing materials, type, and design of fence installed shall be of a high quality and durable.
- All fences must be of a permanent kind.
- Once completed, fences must either completely exclude livestock from wooded areas or streams/ponds
 when the project is finished, even if the entire length is not cost shared through Ag Enhancement. The
 length under contract must follow NRCS specifications.
- Fences must connect to another fence or boundary to make a completely fenced in paddock when project is finished, even if the entire length is not cost shared through Ag Enhancement. The length under contract must follow NRCS specifications.
- Landowner agrees to maintain this practice for a period of at least 20 years after the date of completion.

Payment Rates and Limits:

- Cost share is available to landowner and/or farm operator (lessee).
- The maximum for reimbursement is \$1.65 per foot with a cap of 2,500 feet of high tensile or barbed wire per applicant (\$4,125.00) per fiscal year or \$2.25 per foot woven wire, capped at 2,000 feet per applicant per fiscal year (\$4,500.00).
- Reimbursement will <u>not</u> exceed total cost of fencing materials and labor.
- The Fence must be completed and fully functional by April 22, 2022.

Reimbursement Process:

- The payment will be approved as: 1. Receipts are received; 2. Cooperator completes a W-9 form; 3. Site visit is done; 4. Verification form is signed: 5. District approves the payment.
- All receipts and forms are due to the Monongahela Conservation District Office by **April 22, 2022** otherwise payments may be delayed or even denied.
- No contract extensions will be granted for any reason.

Application due May 28, 2021 and must include the following:

- Cooperator Agreement (if applicable)
- Practice Application Form
- Farm map with individual fields and areas identified where the *Fence* is proposed.
- Lease agreement when applicable which is at least the length of the practice life (20 years).
- Application deadline may be extended upon Monongahela Conservation District approval.
