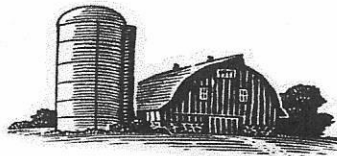

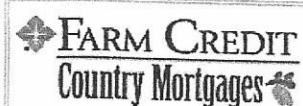

Please plan to join us for these dinner meetings and help us spread the word about these sessions. Checks can be written to Ritchie County Youth Livestock Association and mailed to the

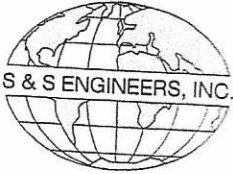

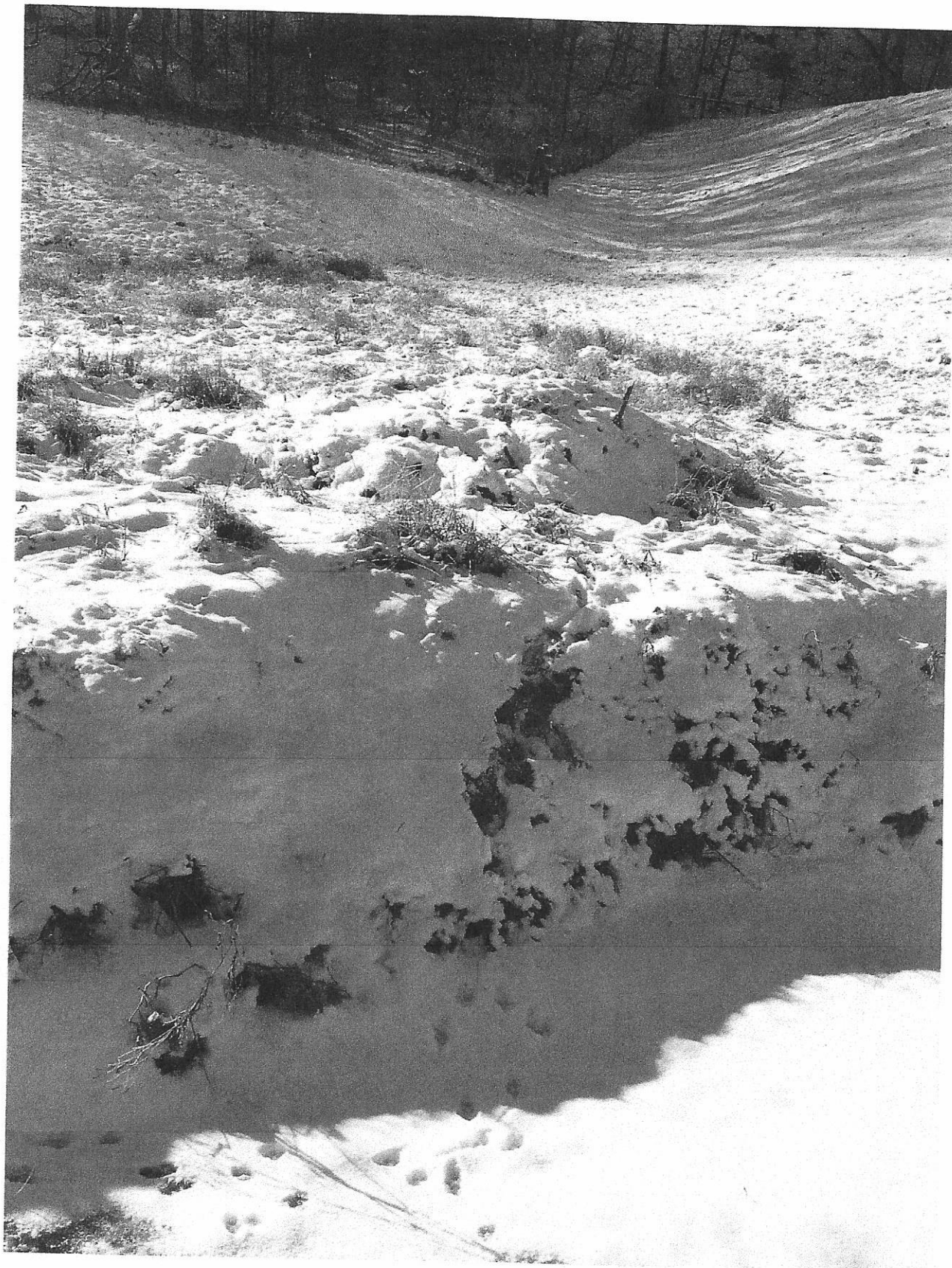
- **North Fork of the Hughes:**

- Work continues with NRCS to develop engineering plans for watershed dams. The seep investigation work being conducted by CEC in South Fork is complete and the reports are being reviewed by NRCS.
