Chairman Gary Sawyers called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made by Gary Truex and seconded by Carolyn Miller to approve the minutes of the October 20, 2016 Regular Board Meeting and the October 26, 2016 Special Board Meeting. Motion passed.

Cooperating Agency Reports

NRCS – Jack O'Connell

Jack O'Connell reported on the EQIP Focused Conservation Approach. Two of the GVCD's proposals were selected for implementation: 1) Ground Water Quality Impacts form Livestock in Stamping Creek Watershed and 2) Meadow River Watershed Livestock Water. He also reported that a proposal for NWQI funding he submitted for the Indian Creek Watershed was approved. The first year will focus on technical assistance and financial assistance will follow in the next year. Finally, he noted that the Lewisburg NRCS office will be getting

another staff member through the Pathway program. A copy of his written report with more information is attached.

Timothy VanReenen moved on behalf of the committee to approve all payments except the one to Supervisor Jerry Clifton. Gary Truex seconded the motion. Motion passed. Jerry Clifton then recused himself. Timothy VanReenen moved on behalf of the committee to approve the payment to Jerry Clifton. Gary Truex seconded. Motion passed. Jerry Clifton rejoined the meeting. Timothy VanReenen moved on behalf of the committee to approve the one cancellation. Gary Truex seconded. Motion passed. It was noted that this cancellation will automatically fund three more lime applications, which will be all of the approved lime applications.

Grassland Committee:

Gary Truex reported on behalf of the committee that Barry Level and Dennis Burns have prepared an outline for a comprehensive conservation education program, a copy of which was provided to the Supervisors. Discussion ensued. Gary Truex moved on behalf of the committee to approve the outline. Timothy VanReenen seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Building/Equipment Committee:

Gary Truex reported on behalf of the committee that the new building is nearing completion. Discussion ensued. It was suggested that a Finance committee meeting be held in addition to regular committee meetings to discuss final payment arrangements. The Board asked Jeremy Salyer about restrictions on residual CDO funds. Jeremy stated that those funds were to be used at the District's discretion.

There was discussion regarding the semi-annual transfer of funds to the equipment repair account. It was noted that a transfer had not been made since March 2015. Discussion ensued regarding equipment revenue and expenses and needing to do an analysis of cost/benefit of repairs, etc. It was noted that this could also be addressed in the

Finance Committee meeting previously discussed. Lynn will ask Eugene Wickline to attend the committee meetings for input on these issues. Gary Truex moved to transfer \$1,650.00 to the equipment repair account, to "catch up" the semi-annual transfers. Timothy VanReenen seconded. Motion passed.

Watershed Reports

- WVCA O, M & R Report Judith Lyons' report was read by Gary Sawyers. A copy is attached. Lynn Hutchison
 noted that an OASIS alert was just received that funding had been transferred to the District's receiving account
 and a NTP could be issued for the Howards Creek floatable debris removal. There was also discussion about
 potential work to be done in Rainelle and how to incorporate OM&R requirements into any potential
 agreement.
- Gary Sawyers reported that he has asked Gene Saurborn to look at the creek on Ronceverte Hill due to several
 concerns voiced by residents to Boogie Ambler.

Besides things already covered, he noted that the AgEP State Committee is starting conversation regarding method of allocation for future funding and that any suggestions should be voiced now. He also reported a 2% budget cut which equaled approximately \$156k for the WVCA. Finally, he said that there is discussion happening regarding potential changes to the format of the annual awards banquet and requested that any thoughts, concerns, or suggestions be shared with Brian Farkas or Timothy VanReenen.

NRCS Report – Greenbrier Valley Conservation District November 17, 2016

Farm Bill Programs

EQIP-Focused Conservation Approach

On November 4th, State Conservationist Louis Aspey announced that two of the Greenbrier Valley Conservation District's Focused Conservation Approach proposals have been selected for implementation. These are:

Ground Water Quality Impacts from Livestock in Stamping Creek Watershed (Pocahontas) Meadow River Watershed Livestock Water (Greenbrier)

Funding will be provided after WV receives its 2017 budget. For planning purposes, it is anticipated that proposals will be funded at or near the requested levels.

CSP

All staff are working on Conservation Stewardship Program renewal contracts. These are to be obligated by December 15, 2016. There are eighteen contracts up for renewal, eight in Pocahontas County, six in Monroe, and four in Greenbrier. The five-year value of these is over \$250,000.

NWQI

Late in September I was informed of a last-minute chance to submit a watershed for inclusion in the National Water Quality Initiative (NWQI). Lee Godbey and I worked quickly with other district, Area, and State Office staff to produce a proposal for the Indian Creek (Burnside Branch) watershed addressing water quality. The proposal was officially approved for funding on November 8. Continuous Technical Assistance (CTA) funds of up to \$37,730 will be distributed in FY2017 and Financial Assistance (FA) funds (unknown amount) will come in FY2018.

Personnel

NRCS accepted applications from recent graduates in Puerto Rico through the Pathway program, a means to introduce students to a possible career with NRCS. One of these applicants may land a position in Lewisburg. A panel of applicants was provided last month and offers are being made.

Other News.

- Several staff members attended Interagency Coordination Tool, Soil Health, and Nutrient Management training in the past month.
- Agronomic spot checks were conducted in all three counties, with no deficiencies.
- Engineering spot checks were conducted in Greenbrier County, with good reports.
- Katy is working with Bob Martin on seven ACEP/FRPP applications (easement).
- Susan and Katy participated in the Annual Women in Ag Conference while Katy participated in the Annual Farm Bureau Conference, and Envirothon meeting.
- It has been a busy month for practice implementation in all counties. Field office staff continue to assist, especially with producers who have fallen behind in their contracts.



November 2016 WVCA Report

The WVCA is encouraging Conservation Districts to review and update your District Policy Manuals. In addition to your policy manual you are encouraged to review your CD Employee Manual (if you have one) and your CD Plan of Work. If you are already doing these reviews, please disregard this request.

AGEP:

- February 2017 Comments reviewed and forms revised

- Mid-March 2017 CDs submit recommendations for FY 18 practices
- Late March 2017 State AgEP committee to meet and review proposed changes for FY 18 and establish allocation formula
- April 2017 Presentation of FY 18 AgEP to SCC
- June 15, 2017 Deadline for CDs submit final practice list to WVCA (CDs can submit final list any time after SCC approval)
- July 1, 2017 Start of FY 18 program
- July 31, 2017 CDs submit annual progress report (per legislative rule)

The AgEP funding allocation formula will be looked at soon by the state AgEP committee. If you have comments on what factors you would like to see utilized in the formula, please contact your district state AgEP committee member or Jennifer Skaggs.

WVCA Budget:

No word on the budget, but we are anticipating a mid-year budget cut given year-to-date revenue collections. At the end of September, revenue was \$81 million behind estimates.

Now is the time for districts to explore additional funding opportunities/partnerships to maintain local programming. It's also time to talk to their local representatives about the work of their districts, and why it's important to maintain funding.

Legislative Tour for dams:

A legislative tour of three New Creek sites was held on 10-24-16. Representatives from Manchin, Capito, and Mooney's office were present. The intent of the tour was to showcase issues that the partnership faces with rehab, maintenance and easements.

Agricultural Day at the Capitol

Agricultural Conservation Day will be February 22, 2016. Please make appointments to see your House and Senate representatives before going to Agricultural Conservation Day. There will also be a Legislative breakfast this morning. Please contact your representatives to invite them to the breakfast.

Awards Banquet

Brian would like input on proposals to change the annual awards luncheon. There have been some VERY PRELIMINARY discussions about changing the awards luncheon from October to the annual AG Day at the Legislature. This would delay the farm tour until late September, early October.

The discussion has been around trying to get greater legislative attention. If we have the banquet at the Capitol during the session, we would have greater turnout from supervisors, who in turn can invite their local legislators to the luncheon. Lawmakers need to see the progress and the about of work the farmers put into their farms.

WVCA is interested in your comments in how to improve the luncheon with the goal of having more of an impact. The luncheon would take the place of the breakfast.

Supervisors would still be responsible for meeting with their legislators that day.

WVCA Project Section:

EWP

- Debris removal contracts were completed in GVD, CCD, LKCD and ECD. The total for this work is \$1,026,673. To date, there have been 411 CCR's taken.
- Planned work:
 - Debris removal contracts are complete in Greenbrier, Webster and Nicholas and Clay Counties.
 - Working with NRCS, we have identified 62 eligible bank stabilization sites using riprap and gabions.

- Working with Roane, Greenbrier, Webster and Kanawha Counties, we are identifying streams that have limited capacity due to sedimentation.
- We have riparian clean up (loose debris) work planned for sites in Greenbrier County.

OM&R

- Project Section staff is performing monthly and quarterly inspections of watershed dams. There is still O&M work in progress. Work has been delayed in some areas due to EWP work. To date, there has been \$406,659.31 spent.
- Work continues with NRCS to develop engineering plans for watershed dams. The seep investigation work being conducted by CEC in South Fork is currently underway.
- The Harmon Creek 13 (NPCD) contract is underway.

Dam Rehab

- Gannett Fleming is continuing to work on planning studies for Brush Creek 9 & 15 and New Creek 1 & 17, and perform the construction oversight for UDC1.
- Upper Deckers 1 construction is slated for 2017/2018.
- A scoping meeting was held on September 20, 2016.
- NPCD, SCD, MCD and PVCD Please track hours that District Supervisors attend any rehab meetings.
- Reminder: Rehab meetings are held the first Wednesday of each month. Any District that has rehab projects can participate in these meetings by phone.

Streams

- Work has started on the Bergdoll Bridge (PVCD) contract. This project is in partnership with WVDOH.
- The stream management plan agreement with the Corp (Stream Permit) has been signed. A training for WVCA staff will be held in the near future. Information will be presented to supervisors after the staff training.

Each area manager will be contacting area directors to provide details of activities in their respective areas. As always, feel free to contact Gene or Penny for further information.

CCRs:

• EWP CCR forwarded by Greenbrier OES for Todd Clutter at Clutter Hollow Rd. This is not eligible for removal.

EWP:

• Currently waiting for funding to be sent to the District from the Treasurer's office to start the Howards Ck floatable debris removal. L.D.Hanna is being kept updated and will be able to start when he receives the NTP. The fiscal section reports that the funds should be sent to the District today 11/17 or Friday 11/18.

We are currently working with the Mayor of Rainelle/USACOE/WV National Guard for stream capacity restoration of:

Meadow River-13,490' Little Sewell-5,315' Boggs-3,249'

Permitting and an agreement will have to be completed before the work can be started in 2017. We plan to begin the survey and assessment process on January 9th, 2017.

• South Fk of Cherry 1st phase is completed. Ross Tuckwiller will be working on the design and plans for Phase II over the winter with construction next summer.
