## <u>Cost- Share</u> <u>Requirements</u>

Due to new guidelines set by the WVCA, <u>all cost-</u> <u>share applicants must</u> <u>submit an aerial map</u>

of their farm with their application. These maps are made available through your local FSA or NRCS office. Additionally, applicants who are seeking lime or fertilizer must also submit recent (within the past 3 years) soil sample results .

# **District Farmers Recognized**

The Conservation Farm of the Year competition showcases the best examples of farms owned and operated by people who are dedicated to conservation. Farms are judged on several topics such as resource management, conservation plan, best management practices, cooperator contribution and involvement in the community.

With the help of the NRCS, three district cooperator/ farms were chosen and asked to participate in the competition. This year's competition featured farmers from Barbour, Randolph, and Upshur counties. The Tygarts Valley Conservation District held their district farm tour and judging on May 21, 2015. The day long event included a tour of each farm, allowing the farmers to discuss what conservation practices and efforts they've made on their property as well as outline their production.

After tallying the judges scores, the winners were announced as: <u>Ist place</u>– Mike & Pam Kwasniewski (Randolph Co.) <u>2nd place</u>– Tim Woody (Upshur Co.) <u>3rd place</u>– Stan White (Barbour Co.) TVCD congratulates each of these farmers on their accomplishments and continued conservation efforts. The district will be holding a BBQ in their honor, and thanks for their

participation and support.

Our district first place winners will go on to compete in area competition, with the farm tour/judging taking place in late July.

## **Teaching Our Youth**

The 2015 "Agriculture and Natural Resources in the Classroom" event was held on May 4th in Upshur County. This annual event is planned through the Upshur County Extension Office, and other TVCD partners, such as the WV DNR, WV DoF, NRCS, and WV DEP. The event is aimed towards elementary students, and teaches them a variety of topics on the environment, natural resources, and agriculture.

This year's presentations were given at both Union Elementary and Hodgesville Elementary. All school students are encouraged to attend, and between both schools this year, more than 450 children participated. The Tygarts Valley Conservation District was represented at the event by Upshur County Supervisor Rex Reeder, TVCD Outreach Coordinator Joyce Frey, and District Manager Hillary Woofter. Joyce gave a presentation on beekeeping and sting safety, while Hillary led a presentation on groundwater pollution and

conservation.

TVCD looks forward to participating in the event next year, and thanks the students, teachers, and conservation partners who participated in the event.

**Pollinator Workshop** 



TVCD held a Pollinator Workshop at the district office on May 21st, that featured a presentation on local pollinators by Dr. Daniel Frank, WVU Entomologist. Attendees were shown how to identify various species of wasps and bees, and what roles they play in the environment. Barbour County Extension Agent, Josh Peplowski, also gave a short presentation that expanded on the roles of local pollinators, and some of their native habitats.

## Food Prep Classes

Did you know that canning recipes published prior to the mid-1990s are no longer considered safe? Much research has been completed to ensure the safety of home canned goods since then – this means "grandma's recipes" or "the way it's always been done" may not be safe.

The WVU Barbour and Randolph County Extension Services offer help in answering food preservation questions as well as classes on the subject. If you are interested in learning to preserve your garden's bounty (or the bounty of those at farmers markets) or just need a refresher course in how to preserve your foods, the Extension Service can help.

This summer, evening sessions will target waterbath canning and pressure canning. You can register for the following classes by calling the WVU Extension Service in Barbour or Randolph counties.

Water-Bath and Pressure Canning/ Freezing: Learn the basics of up-to-date food preservation techniques and safe preservation methods. Participants will can acid products such as jam, salsa, or pickles, lowacid products such as green beans, other vegetables, beans, or meat, and freeze fruits and vegetables. Participants will take home items prepared.

registration is required on or before July 22<sup>nd</sup> for Philippi classes and July 29<sup>th</sup> for Randolph classes by calling 304-457-3254 or 304-636-2455. Space is limited, call early.

**Cost:** \$10 per person for each two-night class to cover cost of ingredients.
